Photo 2: Japanese trenches and foxholes in tundra near Clevesy Pass, Attu, October 1982.



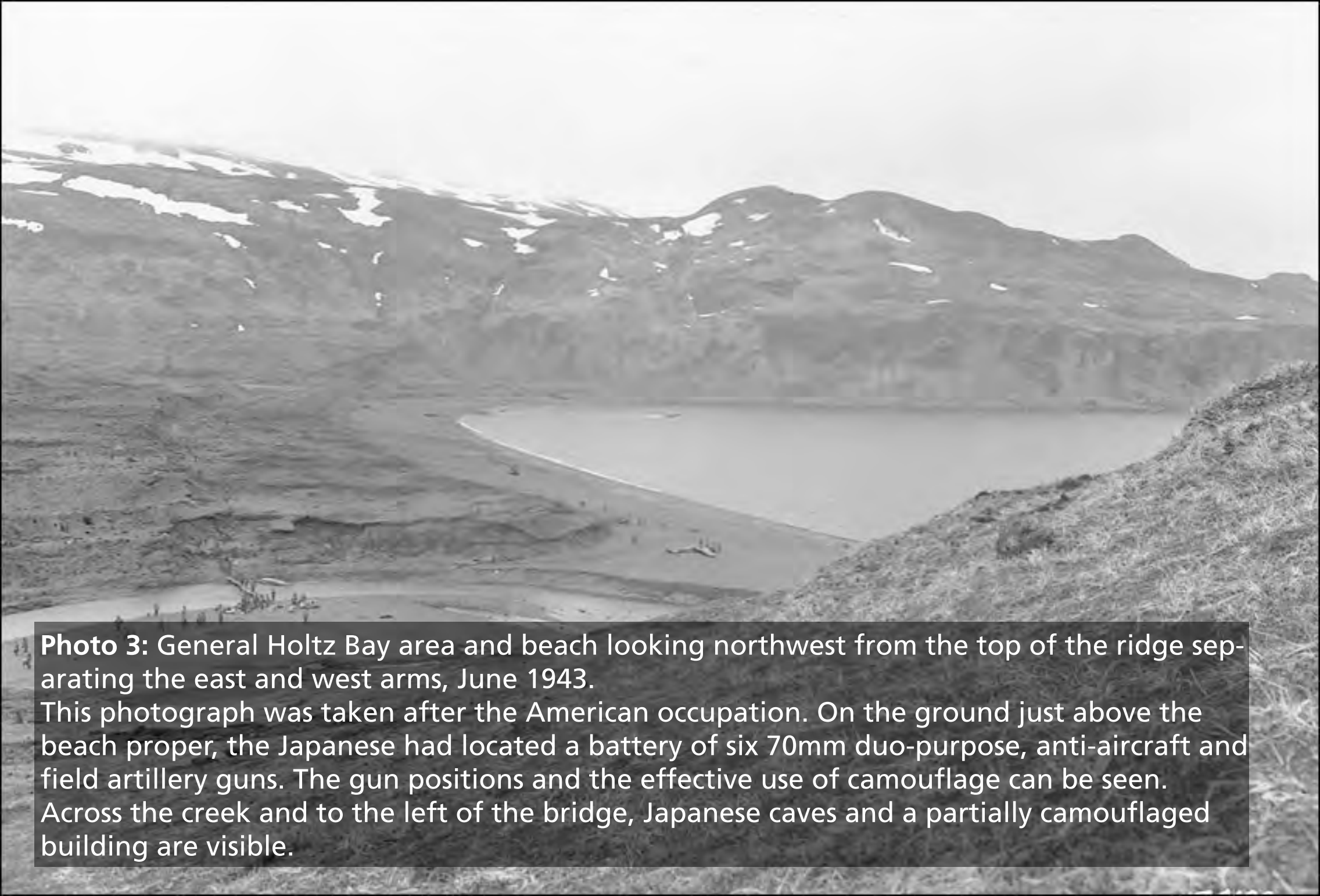


Photo 3: General Holtz Bay area and beach looking northwest from the top of the ridge separating the east and west arms, June 1943.

This photograph was taken after the American occupation. On the ground just above the beach proper, the Japanese had located a battery of six 70mm duo-purpose, anti-aircraft and field artillery guns. The gun positions and the effective use of camouflage can be seen. Across the creek and to the left of the bridge, Japanese caves and a partially camouflaged building are visible.
