

Trail Rules

- Trails are for foot use only. Motor vehicles, bicycles and horses are not allowed.
- Please stay on the trail to protect the plants and animals.
- Metal detecting and relic hunting are prohibited in the park.
- No overnight parking or camping is allowed in any area of the park.

Trail Descriptions

Trail	Hours Open	Distance	Walking Time	Rating	Description
Stage Road Trail	Open 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM during village hours only	0.9 mile (one way)	30 minutes	Easy	Trail follows the route of the historic Lynchburg-Richmond Stage Road from the Confederate Cemetery to the Appomattox River and passes through the historic village. Trail surface is even and wide. There is a long slope with a 100 feet elevation change between the Salute Site and the Appomattox River. The trail is generally open with little shade.
Grant's Approach Trail	Dawn to dusk	1.4 miles (loop)	45 minutes	Easy	Starting at the North Carolina Monument parking lot, this loop trail accesses the North Carolina Monument and Raine Monument and intersects with the Southside Connect Trail. A portion of the trail follows the historic Sear's Lane which General Grant travelled on his way to meet with General Lee. Trail tread is generally even and wide with a gentle grade. The trail is mostly wooded.
Southside Connector Trail	Dawn to dusk	2.4 miles (one way)	1.5 hours	Moderate	This trail links Grant's Approach Trail and Tobacco Prizery Nature Trail. Most of the trail is wide with even tread, however, sections of trail starting at the Appomattox River are narrow and rocky with uneven tread. There are several hills with over 100 feet elevation changes. The trail crosses over River Ridge Road. The trail is mostly wooded. Sections of trail may be flooded during high water events. Do not attempt to cross any section of trail when flooded. There are several bridge crossings which require using a short set of stairs.
Tobacco Prizery Nature Trail	Dawn to dusk	1.2 miles (loop)	40 minutes	Easy	This interpretive trail identifies trees and tells the story of changing land uses. Trail tread is generally level and wide with a gentle grade. There is a section of trail and a bridge that require the use of a short set of stairs. The trail is wooded. The trail intersects with the Southside Connector Trail near the Appomattox River.
Lee's Headquarters Trail	Dawn to dusk	0.3 mile (loop)	10 minutes	Easy	This short hike provides access to the marker denoting the location of Lee's Headquarters. The trail is wooded and somewhat narrow. Tread is generally even but watch for some roots and rocks.
Sweeney Trail	Dawn to dusk	1 mile (one way)	30 minutes	Easy	Starting at the Appomattox River, the trail travels through fields to the historic Sweeney Cabin and the Conner House site. Trail tread is generally even. There is a gentle long slope between the Sweeney Cabin and Conner House site. The trail is open with little shade.
Ferguson Wildlife Trail	Dawn to dusk	0.9 mile (loop)	30 minutes	Easy	This loop trail branches from the Sweeney Trail at the Sweeney Cemetery. The trail follows along the forest edge of the Ferguson field, which is planted in native grasses. A brochure is available at the trail head and provides information on some of the more commonly seen wildlife. Trail has some slopes and tread can be uneven in some areas. There is little shade at mid-day.
Conner-Sweeney Cabin Trail	Dawn to dusk	0.5 mile (one way)	15 minutes	Easy	Opens in Fall 2018. This trail passes through forest and fields and provides a view of the Conner-Sweeney Cabin. A 0.8 mile loop is possible with the north end of the Sweeney Trail. Trail has gentle grade and tread is generally even. Trail passes through two fields managed for wildlife and native pollinator habitat. Some of the trail is wooded.
