



The shores of coastal North Carolina have been Three of the most recognizable crops from the home to Native peoples since time immemorial. New World are called the Three Sisters. 



The Civil War started in 1861 when 11 states attempted to **secede** (separate) from the United States over the issue of slavery.


Imagine being a Union soldier traveling to Roanoke Island in February. The United States Army

Individuals & Their Stories

The Freedmen's * * Colony Schools

Before the Civil War, it was illegal for enslaved people to learn to read or write. Teachers started schools at the Freedmen's Colony on Roanoke Island. They taught formerly enslaved people to read

and write, as well as other skills. Read about what education was like in the Freedmen's Colony schools and compare it to your education.


