## **BIRD CHECKLIST**

This checklist covers Big Hole National Battlefield, and the surrounding area of the Big Hole Valley. Birds that are highlighted are those that that have been sighted specifically on the Battlefield based on surveys performed by UCBN in 1999 and surveys by the University of Montana Avian Science Center (2007-2009). These birds can potentially be found throughout the Big Hole Valley, as well. Other birds listed are sightings within the Big Hole Valley (not Battlefield specific) and come from information found by utilizing the Natural Heritage Tracker at <a href="http://mtnhp.org/Tracker/NHTMap.aspx">http://mtnhp.org/Tracker/NHTMap.aspx</a>.

## KEY:

- C Common frequently or almost always seen
- F Fairly Common seen usually in small numbers
- U Uncommon often overlooked, seldom seen but not a surprise
- R Rare few sightings on record, surprising but not out of range

Sightings will vary greatly depending on the seasons and migration patterns.
