TITLE 36, CHAPTER I
ADDENDUM TO**

**Compendium of Designations, Closures, Request
Requirements and Other Restrictions imposed
under the discretionary authority of the
Superintendent**

In accordance with regulations and the delegated authority provided in Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, Chapter 1, Parts 1 through 7, authorized by Title 16, United States Code, Section 3, the following regulatory provision is established for the proper management, protection, government and public use of the portion of Biscayne National Park under the jurisdiction of the National Park Service.

This discretionary regulation is in addition to the other regulations published in Title 36, CFR, Chapter 1, Parts 2 through 7.

BIOBLITZ: “No Alcohol” Prohibition and Closure

During the Bioblitz event, April 30 through May 1, 2010, the use of alcohol within the Convoy Point area and the Elliott Key harbor and campground is prohibited. Alcohol will also be prohibited on any boat chartered by Biscayne National Park for this event.

For Convoy Point, the area affected by this closure includes the entire developed visitor use area including the Visitor Center complex and grounds, the Headquarters/Administrative offices, all docks, boardwalks, trails and roads.

For Elliott Key, the area affected by this closure includes the developed area adjacent to the harbor, the harbor itself, all existing camping and picnic areas and the ocean-side fire circle, which will be used as a camping area for the event.

For this purpose, the special regulation shall begin at midnight on Friday, April 30, 2010 and end at midnight on Saturday, May 1, 2010.

DETERMINATION: This closure is necessary in order to ensure the safe management of the two day Bioblitz event. Thousands of participants, conducting various activities, can be endangered if alcohol consumption is allowed.

LESS RESTRICTIVE MEASURES: Allowing participants to consume alcohol while conducting various activities scheduled during this event can endangered themselves and others.
