O&W Trail Now Open on a Trial Basis to Wagon

Use. The park begins a pilot project to allow wagons on the O&W trail on a limited basis to determine if the use of wagons is practical and desirable. Wagons will have access points at Mill Creek, Zenith, and Tar Kiln Trail.

During the pilot period, wagon use will be restricted to Monday through Friday only. The route will continue to be open to horses, mountain bikes and pedestrians every day. To access the trail by wagon stop by the Big South Fork park headquarters to sign out a key that will allow access through the gates at these locations.
