VOCABULARY



- Condensation:** The process by which water vapor in the air cools to form tiny droplets of water in the clouds
- Conservation:** Using a natural resource wisely
- Cycle:** Continuing process in which something is used over and over again
- Evaporation:** The process by which water changes from a liquid to a gas
- Ground Water:** Water beneath the surface of the earth
- Natural Resource:** An object found in nature that is available for our use
- Precipitation:** Water falling to the earth as a liquid (rain) or a solid (snow, hail)
- Rain:** Precipitation in the form of liquid water
- Snow:** A crystal made of frozen water vapor
- Surface Water:** Water which has accumulated on top of the ground
- Thermal Pollution:** Polluting water by increasing its temperature; may cause plants and animals to die

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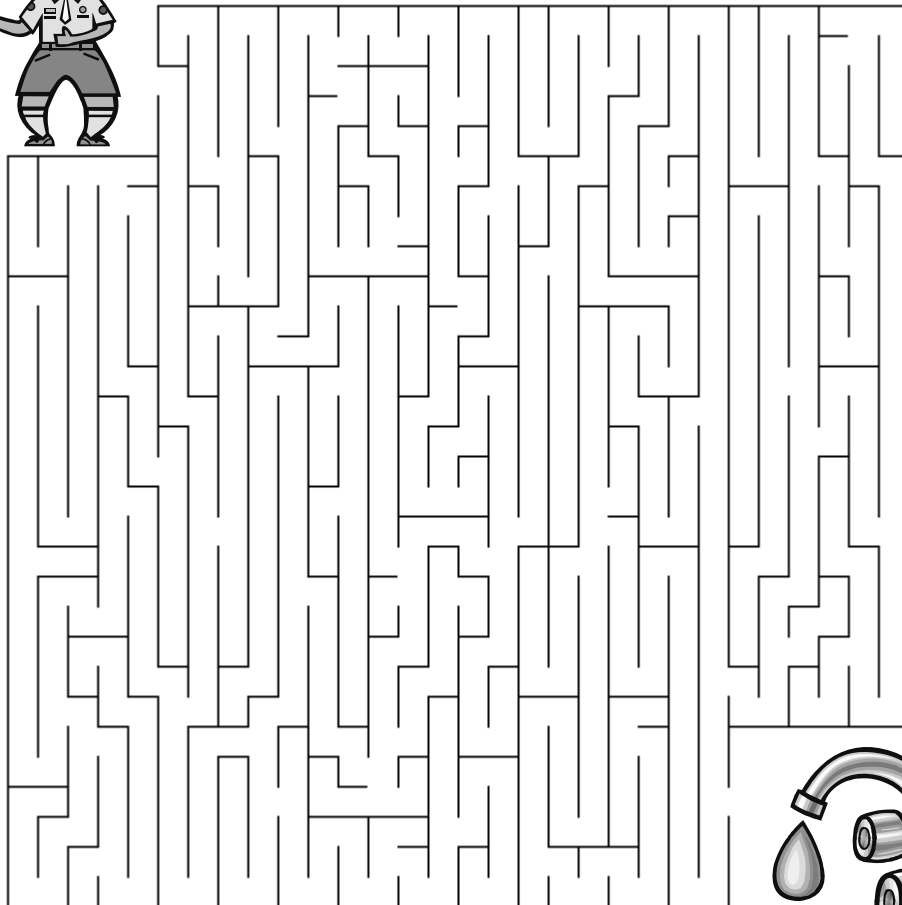
