

South Rim Campground


C-Loop


B-Loop

Campground Regulations

- Wood gathering is not permitted.
- Fires must be attended at all times.
- Please keep your camp clean and do not leave coolers or any food items unsecured.
- Dispose of dirty dish water in toilets, please do not leave any food scraps in your site.
- No bathing or washing dishes at the faucet or drinking fountain.
- Pets must be on a leash at all times, even when they are in your campsite. Please clean up after your pet.
- Do not fill trailer tanks with water from the park. All of the water on the South Rim is trucked in from town.
- Generators are not permitted.
- Quiet hours are 10pm - 6am.

Wildlife

Welcome to Bear Country! When you are staying at the South Rim Campground, you are a guest in the home of several different animals, including black bears. Please do your part in keeping these animals wild by following the guidelines below.

Please secure ALL scented items at ALL times either in your vehicle or a bear box:

- All food (including dog food) and trash, please do not hang trash from trees
- All drinks, even in sealed cans or bottles
- Gum, mints, and candy
- Tobacco
- Insect repellent and sun block
- Soap, including dish soap, hand sanitizers, and

all other cleaning products

- Cosmetics, toiletries, scented tissue
- Citronella or other candles

If you are new to camping in bear country, please see a park ranger or the camp host for important information and regulations.

Please do everything you can to keep your food and trash away from bears and other animals. A fed bear is a dead bear.
