To Be a Ranger

June 13 – 10:00 a.m.

To Be a Leader

July 11 – 10:00 a.m.

Learn about team building and the leadership styles of Booker T. Washington. Program includes a team scavenger hunt so Junior Rangers can demonstrate their leadership skills.

To Be a Naturalist

August 8 – 10:00 a.m.

Hike the Jack-O-Lantern Branch Trail and study plants and animals like a naturalist. Participate in a stream activity to learn about the importance of clean water.
