



This example uses the Union Pacific Tour Car and Guide Photo/image. The image was scanned from a slide at the following original dimensions – 1.33 inches x .88 inches at 2000 dpi/13.2 megabytes.


Picture is shown in Adobe Photoshop Elements using the [Print Size] button.




To resize the image we selected [Image] from the menu and then selected Resize -> Image Size (shown)




This gives the following options



By selecting [Resolution:] we change it to 600 (pixels/inch=ppi) which changes the dimensions to the new size as shown.



Then pressing [Print Size] we can see that the image has “grown” to 4.3 inches by 2.9 inches (shown)



The image is then saved as a JPEG file (.jpg extension) resulting in a much smaller size (3.2 megabytes) than the original but still printable for most applications. We hope this will help.
