


Gray Whale Math Worksheet

1. Gray Whales eat hundreds of pounds of food each day. That's about 8 trash cans full of food! Color in 8 trash cans below to show how much a Gray Whale eats.



2. Gray Whales travel about 10,000 miles during their yearly migration. If you walked 10 miles every day, it would take you almost 3 years to go the same distance! How old will you be in 3 years?

3. A whale's tail is called a fluke. The largest fluke belongs to the Blue Whale, and it's about 15 feet across! A Gray Whale's fluke is about 10 feet across. How many Gray Whale flukes would it take to make 1 Blue Whale fluke? Color in the flukes below to show your answer.



4. Draw a line to connect the words to the correct body part on the whale below.


BLOWHOLE






5. Whales are much bigger than humans. The most common adult human is only about 130 pounds, but adult Gray Whales are commonly 60,000 pounds! Color in the graph on the right to show how much 60,000 pounds is – each square is 10,000 pounds.



7. Baby Gray Whales are about 15 feet long when they are born but are about 45 feet long as adults. That means it takes 3 baby whales to equal the size of 1 adult whale! Circle the correct box below.
