SPECIAL PROGRAM AND RESERVATION POLICY

FEE PROGRAMS: • Tickets are non-refundable, available in advance, and must be purchased either in person at visitor centers, or by phone with a credit card, prior to 4:30 PM daily. • Canoe Adventure trips cost \$20 per adult, \$14 per child 16 and under. • Salt Pond Paddle trips cost \$17 per adult, \$12 per child 16 and under. • Surfcasting 101 program costs \$15 per person. • Canoe experience is MANDATORY for all but Salt Pond Paddle trips due to currents and winds. • Minimum age is 6 for canoe trips and 12 for surfcasting. • All equipment is provided unless otherwise noted. • You may have to wade and assist with moving equipment during canoe programs. • Wear shoes (required) that can get wet.

RESERVATION POLICY: • All programs requiring reservations may be reserved no more than seven days in advance.

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September 2 - Great Island Hike - 3 hours, 3 miles. Traverse salt marshes, dunes, and Cape Cod Bay, and explore the woods of the interior of the island. Scenic vistas of Wellfleet Harbor will also be seen from high cliff tops. Along the way examine the rich history and lore associated with this early whaling outpost. There will be some walking in soft sand and off trail.

September 9 - Hike: An "Island" Settlement: The History of Bound Brook - 2 hours, 2 miles. Explore this northernmost of the so-called "Islands" of Wellfleet which flank the shore of Cape Cod Bay. Bounded also by the Herring River to the east and Bound Brook to the north, Bound Brook Island is the only one of this group with homes still standing from this earliest period of English settlement in Wellfleet.

September 16 - Hike: Freshbrook Village: Gone But Not Forgotten - 3 hours, 3 miles. Hike along some of the trails and jeep roads of the Marconi area to explore the history, activities, and events of this early Wellfleet village and the surrounding area. Wear long pants and comfortable walking shoes.




September 23 - Kayak Trip - 3 hours. Explore the beautiful protected waters of Pleasant Bay in your own kayak. Participants must be experienced paddlers and be prepared to get wet. Shoes and PFDs must be worn at all times.

September 30 - Hike: In the Vagabond's Footsteps - Walking Henry Beston's Great Beach - Up to 3 hours, 3 miles. Henry Beston's words in *The Outermost House* have drawn people over the decades to Coast Guard Beach. And while his little house has long since been lost to the ocean, it is still possible to experience Beston's beach. Hike and revisit the classic book and discover the beach for yourself. Walking in soft sand.





October 7 - Hike: Freshbrook Village: Gone But Not Forgotten - 3 hours, 3 miles. See description from September 16.

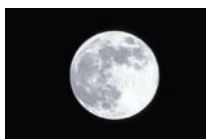

NIGHT WALK: THE ORIONID METEOR SHOWER - Saturday, October 17, 7 PM. 1 hour. Free. Celebrate the International Year of Astronomy by going stargazing on this night of a new moon. If clear, the skies should be dark enough to see meteors radiating from the area of the sky in which the constellation Orion sits. Meet at the national seashore Head of the Meadow Beach parking area (not the town lot), off Route 6, Truro. Bring a flashlight, blanket, warm clothes, and binoculars if you have them.
