Visitor Center Information

Salt Pond Visitor Center, 50 Nauset Road, off Route 6, Eastham, 508-255-3421 Daily 9 am to 5 pm

This visitor center offers expansive views of Salt Pond, Nauset Marsh, and the Atlantic, and has an outstanding museum. The Nauset Marsh Trail, Buttonbush Trail, and Nauset Bicycle Trail are nearby.

Province Lands Visitor Center, 171 Race Point Road, off Route 6, Provincetown, 508-487-1256 Daily 9 am to 5 pm

Outdoor observation decks offer sweeping views of the ocean and the surrounding dune landscape. The Province Lands Bicycle Trail, Race Point Beach, and the Beech Forest Trail are nearby.


Salt Pond Visitor Center (Eastham) and Province Lands Visitor Center (Provincetown) have staff to assist with trip planning, restrooms, exhibits, an award-winning orientation film (open captions audio description, and assistive listening devices available), and large print and Braille versions of some park publications. The America's National Parks stores are open daily, with apparel, books, field guides, and a variety of seashore-related items for sale. Many ranger-guided programs occur at or depart from the visitor centers. Ask about Junior Ranger and B.A.R.K. Ranger programs.

Captain Penniman Home Tour – Starting June 19, Wednesdays, 11 am, 1 hour. Captain Penniman was one of the most successful whaling captains in New England. Join us to explore his 1868 home and learn about his family's hardships, adventures, and lifestyle. Meet at the Penniman House in Eastham.

Discover Nauset Marsh Hike – June 6, 16, 18, 22, 23, 25, 29, 30. 11 am, up to 1.5 miles. Walk through Cape Cod's geologic past, hear the stories of the cultural landscape, and explore the wonders of the nature world throughout the park. Meet at the Salt Pond Visitor Center. ✓

Salt Pond Paddle – June 26 & 28, 10 am, 2.5 hours, 1 mile. A ranger will share the nature of marshes and kettle ponds on this easy paddling trip via canoe. The minimum age is 6 years old, must be 12 years old to paddle. All equipment provided. Reservations are required and may be made up to one week in advance by calling Salt Pond Visitor Center at (508) 255-3421, ext. 0.

Sharks and Seals: Cape Cod's Dynamic Duo Walk (Eastham) – Mondays and Thursdays (except June 10, 13 & 20), 9:30 am, 1 hour, up to 1 mile in loose sand. Examine the relationship between sharks and seals and their roles in the balance of a healthy marine environment. Bring binoculars if you have them for seal viewing. Reservations are required and may be made up to one week in advance by calling Salt Pond Visitor Center at (508) 255-3421, ext. 0.

Terrace Talk – Daily beginning June 13 (various dates prior, check calendar), 2 pm, 30 minutes. Cape Cod National Seashore is full of animals, history, and pristine landscapes. Join a ranger for a presentation exploring one of the many wonders of the seashore. Meet at the Salt Pond Visitor Center.

Three Sisters Lighthouses Tour – Tuesdays starting June 18, 11 am, 1 hour. These 19th-century lighthouses once provided a beacon for sailors off the shore of Nauset Light Beach. Explore their history and importance. Meet at the Three Sisters Lighthouse parking lot – space is limited – on the north side of Cable Road.

Horseshoe Crab Science Thursday, June 20, 2 pm at East

Join Cape Cod National Seashore Aquatic Ecologist Sophia Fox and researchers from the Antioch University for a look at what East Harbor's restoration and reintroduction of salt water almost two decades ago has meant for horseshoe crabs how the population is faring today.

Big View Hiking – Wednesdays, 9 am, 2-3 hours, 4-6 miles. Join us for an energetic, cardiovascular hike to some of the most majestic ocean and bay views in the national seashore. Call 508-487-1256 for location details. ✓

Dune and Bog Walk - Saturdays & Sundays, 10 am, 1-2 hours, 1-2 miles in loose sand. Head out from the Province Lands Visitor Center to explore an enchanting landscape of sand dunes and wild cranberry bogs. Meet at the Province Lands Visitor Center.

Explore the Seashore – Mondays (except June 10), 2 pm, 2 hours, 2-3 miles in loose sand. Explore the wild habitats, fascinating nature, and captivating history of the Province Lands. Slog through sand and traipse up and down dunes in this immersive experience. Call 508-487-1256 for location details. ✓

Full Moon Campfire – *Friday, June 21, 6 pm, 1 hour.* Enjoy sunset on the beach and an evening of folklore and games around the campfire. Bring a beach chair or towel to sit on. Highland House Museum – *Mondays through Saturdays, 10 am-4:30 pm.* This former 1907 hotel now serves as a museum, providing fascinating insight into the culture and history of the Outer Cape, including the Wampanoag, arts traditions, industry, and tourism. \$8 for adults, \$7 for seniors, students, and children ages 6-17. Highland Light Tour – *Daily, 9 am to 5 pm (last tour at 4:30).* The original Highland (Cape Cod) Light was constructed in 1797, making it the first lighthouse on Cape Cod. The current 1857 tower is the third on the site, and recently underwent a major rehabilitation. Tours are operated by seashore partner, Eastern National. www.highlandlighthouse.org

Kayak the Outer Cape – Fridays except June 14, tide-dependent, up to 3 hours, 3 miles. Kayak with a ranger in a meandering marsh or a dune-sided lake. One of the best ways to immerse yourself in the seashore! Previous kayaking experience is required; minimum age is 12. Reservations are required and may be made up to 3 days in advance by calling Province Lands Visitor Center at (508) 487-1256.

Old Harbor Life-Saving Station Open House – Fridays through Mondays except June 14, 2-4 pm, drop in. Built in 1898, Old Harbor is the last intact life-saving station of the original 13 on Cape Cod. A visit feels like stepping into a turn-of-the-century, working station while the crew is out on patrol. Old Harbor is located at Race Point Beach, Provincetown. Beach fees may apply.
