

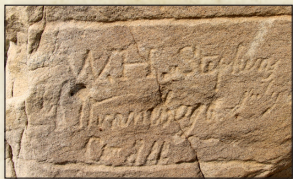
CASPER TO SPLIT ROCK, WYOMING

Between 1840 and 1869, approximately 500,000 emigrants moved across the western plains in search of free farmland, freedom of religion, wealth, and new business opportunities. They traveled to the Oregon's Willamette Valley, the Great Salt Lake Valley, and the California gold fields.

Explore the Oregon, California, Pony Express, and Mormon Pioneer National Historic Trails. This itinerary begins at the National Historic Trails Interpretive Center in Casper, Wyoming.

To retrace the trails, follow Route 220 south from Casper to County Road 308 near Bessemer Bend and head west. Turn left onto County Route 319 (Oregon Trail) and follow the route south. Rejoin Route 220 at the intersection south of Prospect Hill.
