Cane River Creole National Historical Park is proud to host the first annual “Cane River Music Festival” on May 1st, 2010. Headlining the festival will be Louisiana native and Blues Hall of Famer Bobby Rush. Opening acts will include Goldman Thibodeaux and the Lawtell Playboys and the Hardrick Rivers Revue.

The festival will begin at 11:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. This is an outdoor event located on the grounds of Oakland Plantation at Cane River Creole National Historical Park. This is a picnic setting; folding chairs, umbrellas and food are permitted. Parking is limited and car-pooling is advised. **NO ALCOHOL** is allowed.

This is a free ticket event and tickets are limited to 4 per person. Tickets will be available on the following dates: **April 21, 22, 23, 28, 29, and the 30th** from 2:00- 4:30 p.m. at Cane River Creole National Historical Park Headquarters located at 400 Rapides Drive Natchitoches, LA 71457 and **April 24th** from 8:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. at Oakland Plantation located at 4386 Highway 494 Bermuda, LA 71456.

Cane River Creole National Historical Park is located 10 miles south of Natchitoches at Oakland Plantation in Bermuda and Magnolia Plantation is 20 miles south of Natchitoches.
