8 pm: Star Party in the Park

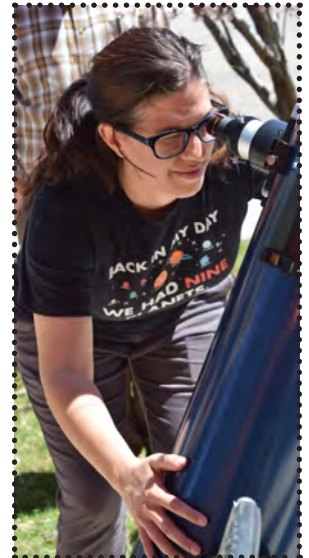
Come out and join the St. George Astronomy Group for a star party. We will be looking at planets, stars, moons and distant galaxies. We will start at dusk, weather permitting.
