

An overview of the participants, presentations, and discussions is available in the proceedings reports for each conference, as well as a daily agenda. For this conference there were approximately nine people in the room and over three days (March 21-23) they discussed Chaco organizational models, chiefdoms, network vs. corporate systems, complexity of the system, pit structures, ceramics, household and society economies, ceremonies, burials, lithics, groundstone, turquise, production workshops, and a lengthy summary of topics for which the groups worked on a consensus. Of note: the sessions often used visual aids such as maps, book images, and outlines of discusion on a blackboard.

There is an audio cassette recording March 20th, a public lecture by Colin Renfrew, "Archeology and Language: The Puzzle of Indo-European Origins".

### 02. Society and Polity Conference Recordings, 1999 May 3-7

An overview of the participants, presentations, and discussions is available in the proceedings reports for each conference, as well as a daily agenda. For this conference there were approximately eleven people in the room and over two days (May 4th and 5th) they discussed Chaco societal organization, including leadership and models of social organization.

Of note: Tape 1 is blank and did not record the morning session of May 4th.

For this conference there were approximately twenty people in the room and over three days (September 25-27) they discussed Chaco as a system, communities, great houses, the need to create a database where questions could be evaluated regarding the Chaco World, and how to move the discussion into the future. The final day was dedicated to a public session. These recordings are in some parts inaudible, the recordings are muffled. Tape 5 and Tape 6 are audible.
