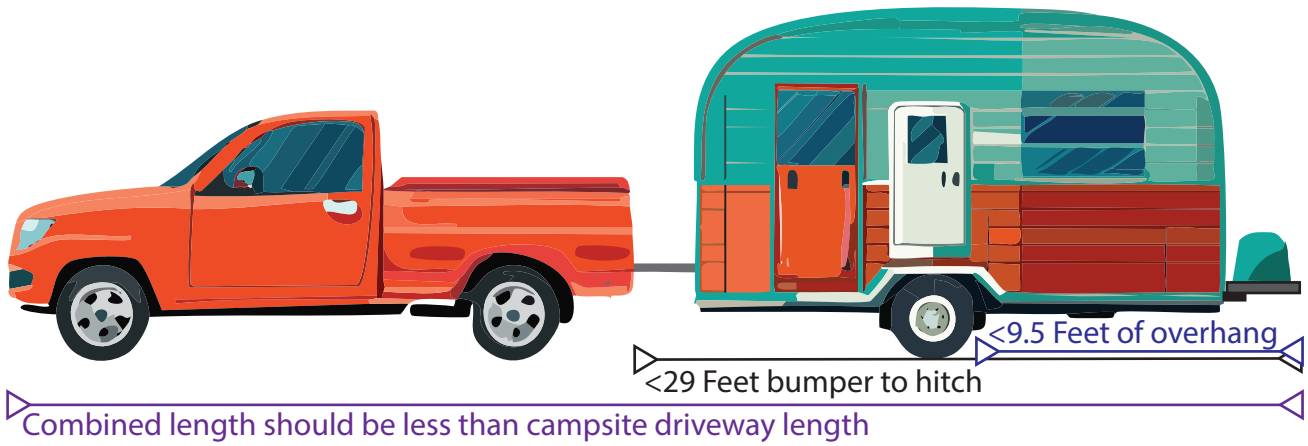

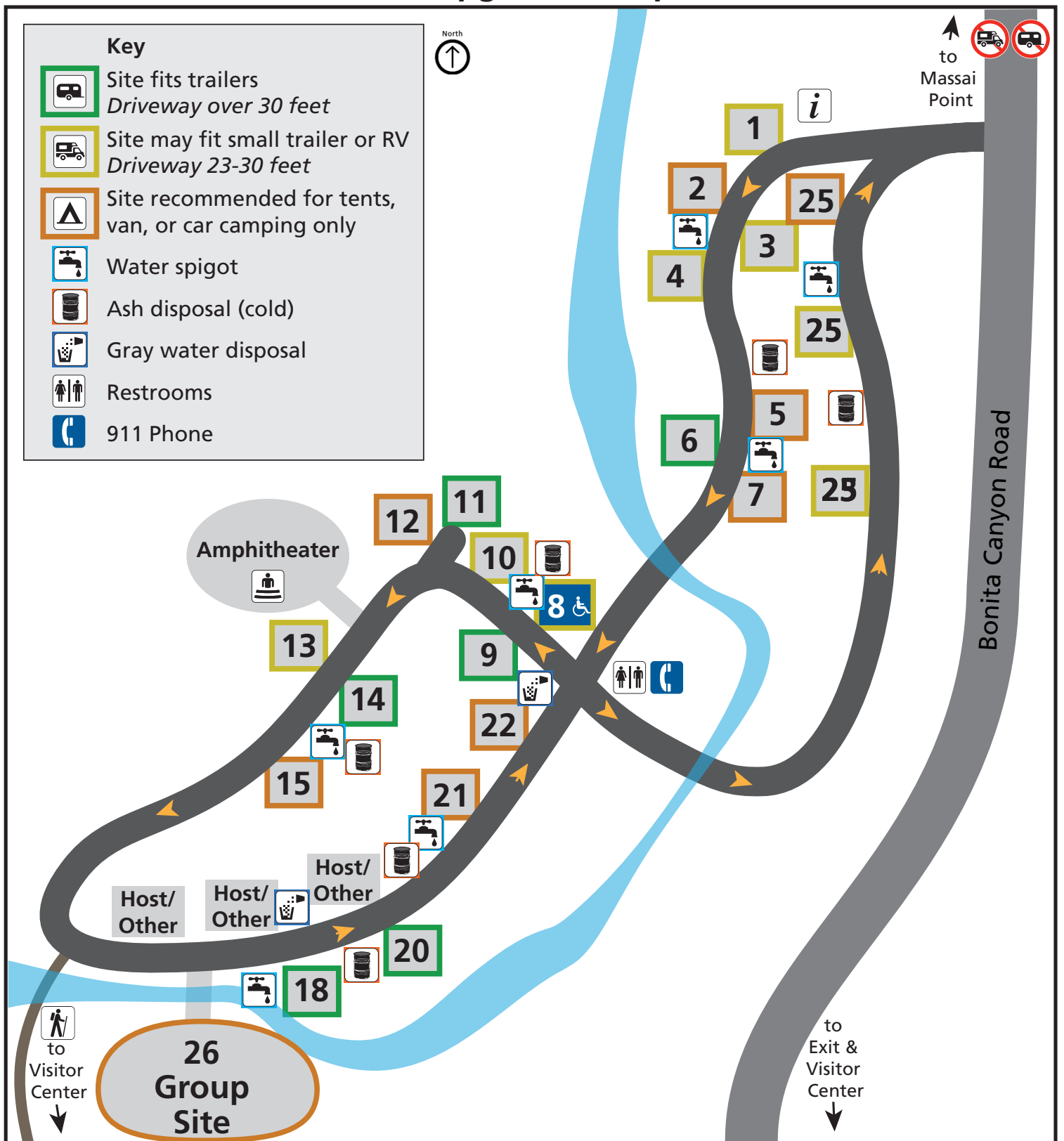


Maximum vehicle length is 29 feet (8.8 m), hitch to bumper. Unusually tall or wide vehicles and anything with an overhang over 9 ft may scrape the road or trees entering and exiting.

Read site notes & driveway length to confirm the site is level and long enough for both vehicles.

Note: All trailers & vehicles over 24 feet are prohibited on the scenic drive past the campground.

Campground Map



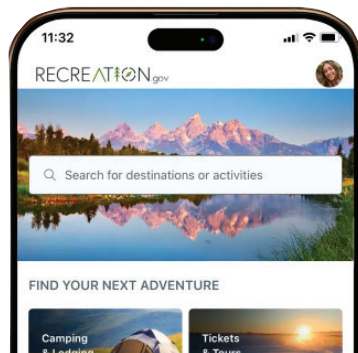
Basic Information

Reserve a site at www.recreation.gov or call 1-877-444-6777. All sites require a reservation. Reserve the day of if available or up to 6 months in advance.



- **Arrival time: Noon or later**
No check-in needed. Early arrivals may notify host & occupy their reserved site if vacant.
- **Check out: 11 am**
Clean up and leave your site promptly by 11 am. Remove trash, litter, ashes, and any belongings.
- Generators allowed: **8-10 am and 4-6 pm**
- Quiet hours: **8 pm to 8 am**
- Maximum of **2 tents, 2 vehicles, and 8 people** for standard site.
- Reservations may be canceled if the site is not occupied within 24 hours.

Safety

Animals

We have all kinds, from little mice and rats to big bears.

- Keep **food and trash** in metal boxes provided
- Don't empty liquids on the ground
- Stay with pets to **prevent attack** or mauling
- Stay far away from animals
- **Rabies** is in the area - seek immediate attention if bitten



Fire

- Use **designated grills**
- Drown ashes in water after fire
- Put cold ashes in barrels provided

Pets



Bringing a pet to camp limits your freedom in the park! Pets:

- Must be leashed at all times
- Must not be unattended or tied out
- Are prohibited on most trails

Why?

- Pets are more likely to be attacked
- Unleashed pets chase animals and sniff holes



Even the most well-behaved dog may react unexpectedly to a bear, fox, coati or skunk.

Seasonal

March, April, October & Holidays	Busy times; reserve months in advance
April to July	Increased fire restrictions are common
June to September	Monsoons can flood washes; sites may be closed for flood risk
November to March	Snow and freezing temperatures possible

Prohibited

Help NPS keep this campground and wilderness safe for future generations by following the rules.

- No tying to trees
- No ground fires & fireworks
- No collecting wood or other things
- No feeding animals or birds
- No leaving food or trash out
- No day use picnics; picnic tables for camping reservations only
- No littering or tossing cigarette butts
- No dumping liquids on the ground
- No playing in the road
- No skating, scooters, or related devices
- No unleashed or unattended pets
- No flying drones or other objects
- No parking or camping outside your designated site

Failure to comply with rules may result in fines or expulsion per CFR 36.
