

# CHIRICAHUA NATIONAL MONUMENT

## BONITA CANYON CAMPGROUND REGULATIONS

- Welcome to the Bonita Canyon Campground. The 22 individual sites are available on a first come, first served basis. **SAVING OR SUBLETTING SITES IS NOT ALLOWED.** Site must be shown as occupied when left unattended. Your receipt (flap of fee envelope) needs to be in the clip on the numbered site post. Additional camping is available in the Coronado National Forest Service land 5 miles up Pinery Canyon Road, which is near the park entrance station.
- DAY USE PICNICKING IS **NOT** PERMITTED IN THE CAMPGROUND.
- Camping fees: **\$12.00 per night, per individual site.** **GOLDEN AGE** and **GOLDEN ACCESS** Passport holders pay half price or **\$6.00** per night. **NATIONAL PARKS PASS** and **GOLDEN EAGLE** Passport holders must **pay full price.** Camping fees must be paid within thirty (30) minutes of site selection and occupation. Change is available at the Visitor Center. If necessary, bring your receipt to the Entrance Station for a refund.
- Checkout time: **11:00 AM.** Maximum length of stay: **14 days per calendar year.**
- Maximum number per individual site: **8 people, 2 vehicles, and 2 tents.** Vehicles must be parked so that all tires are within the parking space of the site.
- Please use the tent pads when setting up your tent.
- **Recreational Vehicles:** Maximum motorhome or trailer length is 29 feet or less. There are RV parks in Willcox for larger vehicles. There are no hook-ups (electricity, water, sewer). A gray water dump station is location near the restrooms. There are **NO** black water dump stations in the Monument. The closest dump stations are in Willcox.
- The Group Site will accommodate 8 to 24 people. Fees are \$3 per person, per night with an 8 person minimum occupancy. A \$24.00 nonrefundable fee is required to reserve the site and will be applied to your fees for the first night. Additional fees for more nights and people are to be paid upon arrival at the campground. The site is limited to tents only. Overflowing into other sites is **NOT** permitted. Call 520-824-3560 x501 to make reservations.
- **QUIET HOURS** are from **8:00 PM** to **8:00 AM** and are **STRICTLY** enforced. No generators, loud music or other noise during these times. Please be considerate of your neighbors.
- Ground fires are not permitted - use the cooking grills provided. Be careful with fire and never leave one unattended!
- Wood gathering is **NOT** permitted in the monument, including dead and down wood. You must bring your own firewood or charcoal. Please deposit the ashes from your fire(s) in the metal bucket next to the grill.
- Pets are permitted but must be **LEASHED** and under your control at all times. This is for the safety of you, your pet and wildlife. Javelinas (collared peccaries) have been known to attack dogs. This area of the Southwest is a rabies, bubonic plague, and hanta virus infection zone.
- Please **DO NOT** attempt to feed the wildlife. This practice will put you in danger and is extremely bad for the animals. Citations and fines will be issued.
- **All items that have contacted food--coolers, dishes, cooking utensils, stoves, tin cans and pet bowls--must be securely stored when campsite is unattended. All forms of refuse including food scraps and liquids must be disposed of in the bear-proof trash containers provided. Citations and fines will be issued, if necessary.**
- The use of solar showers and clotheslines is not permitted in the campground.
- The use of rollerblades, skateboards and scooters is not permitted in the Monument.

Always keep in mind that **EVERYTHING** in the Monument is **PROTECTED.**
