


The Lodge and Bunkhouse at Castle Rock Ranch



THE LODGE AT CASTLE ROCK RANCH

"*The Lodge*" is a century-old ranch house completely remodeled to blend the quaintness of yester-year with the convenience and comforts of today. *The Lodge* is available year-round, and reservations are recommended.



What's inside?

The Lodge offers a master bedroom with queen-size bed, flat screen TV/DVD and reading room/den. A TV room with flip-flop sofa converts into a sleeping room for two. A third sleeping room provides a double/twin bunk bed for up to three, and a fourth, "the quiet room" has a twin bed, desk, and private deck.

Other rooms include the fully equipped kitchen, spacious bathroom with tub/shower, dining area, and living room with propane fireplace.

Other amenities include:

- Wi-Fi network: usage fee applies
- Play Station
- Books, games, DVD's
- Outdoor deck, tables and seating for four people

Rental Fee and Reservations

Exclusive rental of *The Lodge* for 1-8 people is \$159* a night. All vehicles entering the park will be required to pay an additional \$5 per day Motor Vehicle Entry Fee or purchase an Idaho State Parks Passport or Annual Motor Vehicle Entrance Sticker for Out-of-State Visitors. THE BUNKHOUSE


Castle Rocks State Park now offers "*The Bunkhouse*" for rent, located next to *The Lodge at Castle Rock Ranch*. This facility is perfect for family reunions and scout groups.

The Bunkhouse offers a rustic, primitive, hostel-style lodging in a communal setting. Guests are housed in an open, one room building with scenic Castle Rocks as the backdrop to the experience.

What's inside?

A comfortable 20x26-foot living area, accommodating from 8 to 12 occupants, that consists of a kitchen/dining area, and sleeping-quarters.

The Bunkhouse is equipped with electricity, a hot-water sink, microwave, coffee pot and trash receptacles. Furniture includes table, chairs, food storage hutch, and wood-burning fireplace for heating. Three bunk-beds (twin over full), a single twin-bed, and a single full-bed (8 beds total) allows for a maximum of 12 individuals. Camp mattresses are provided on all beds. Guests must supply their own sleeping bag, cooking equipment, food, towels and other personal gear. An outside vault toilet is located near-by and showers are available at Smoky Mtn. CG for an additional fee.



Rental Fee and Reservations

Exclusive rental of *The Bunkhouse* for a group (no more than 12 people) is \$106* a night. If you rent *The Lodge* and *The Bunkhouse* concurrently *The Bunkhouse* fee is then reduced to \$79.50* a night. **Individuals** may walk in to rent a bed for one night at a time for \$12.72* plus a \$5 per day Motor Vehicle Entry Fee.

All "Individual Walk-ins" must check in and pay at the Visitor Center before 4:30 p.m. on the day of their arrival or to the on-site facility host. *Includes sales tax

Registration & Check-In/Check-Out (3 p.m./12 p.m.)


Check-In

Check-in time for both *The Lodge* and *The Bunkhouse* is as early as 3:00 p.m. on the day of arrival. Stop at the Visitor Center located in Almo to receive the key. If your party is arriving after office hours call the Visitor Center (208-824-5901) to make arrangements for the key. Office hours 8 a.m.—4:30 p.m. 7 days a week mid-April—October. November—mid-April open weekdays 8 a.m.—4:30 p.m.

Check-Out

Check-out time for both *The Lodge* and *The Bunkhouse* is at 12:00 p.m. on the day of your departure. Please make sure you have collected all of your personal items. Lock the doors and windows and return the key to the Visitor Center. If the Visitor Center is closed, please leave the key on the table inside.

If you encountered any problems or discomforts during your stay, please fill out a comment card to the park manager.




Inside The Bunkhouse at Castle Rock Ranch




Helpful Hints During Your Stay

Park staff want to ensure that you have a safe and memorable experience, so we suggest these helpful hints:

- Stop in at the visitor center in Almo for guidebooks, trail maps, souvenirs, and the latest opportunities and programs.
- For cooler ventilation in summer, turn on the ceiling fan, open the windows in the evening, and close the blinds during the day.
- For additional heating in winter, use the propane fireplace and extra blankets in *The Lodge* or the wood-stove in *The Bunkhouse*.
- Although the facility can be locked when unoccupied, consider locking valuables in your vehicle.



RULES FOR LODGE AND BUNKHOUSE GUESTS

- Pets are not allowed inside the facilities.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited
- Guest may not pitch tents or park other camping units near *The Lodge* and *The Bunkhouse* locations.
- Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.
- Guests are responsible for damages in excess of normal wear and tear, and are also responsible for missing items (if not reported upon check-in).
- Confine outside campfires to the designated fire-ring provided.
- At no time may more than 8 people occupy *The Lodge* and no more than 12 people at *The Bunkhouse*.
- Individual walk-in rates for *The Bunkhouse* are applied per person for adults and children regardless of bunk sharing. Guests are more than welcome to share bottom full bunks.
- Lodge and Bunkhouse guests will be required to pay the \$5 per day, per vehicle state park motor vehicle entrance fee (MVEF) in addition to facility fees. Three vehicles permitted at *The Lodge* and four vehicles at *The Bunkhouse*. Vehicles should be parked in the designated parking areas.
