

## The Lodge at Castle Rock Ranch



Castle Rocks State Park now offers another overnight accommodation:

### ***The Lodge at Castle Rock Ranch***

"The Lodge" is a century-old ranch house totally remodeled to blend the quaintness of yester-year with the convenience and comfort of today. The Lodge is available year-round, and reservations are recommended.

### **What's inside?**

The Lodge offers a master bedroom with queen-size bed, flat screen TV/DVD and reading room/den. A TV room with flip-flop sofa converts into a sleeping room for two. A third sleeping room provides a double/twin bunk bed for up to three, and a fourth, "the quiet room" has a twin bed, desk, and private deck. Other rooms include the fully equipped kitchen, spacious bathroom with tub/shower, dining area, and living room with propane fireplace. Other amenities include:

Snowshoes are provided in winter

### **Rental Fee and Reservations**

Exclusive rental of the lodge for 1- 8 people is \$150 plus sales tax. Rental includes entrance fee to all units of Castle Rocks State Park. To reserve your stay, see "Making a Reservation."

## GUEST INFORMATION

### Registration & Check-In (3 pm)

Castle Rocks State Park's newest overnight accommodation, *The Lodge at Castle Rock Ranch* is located at the park's Ranch Unit in the shadow of 10,339-foot Cache Peak and the Castle Rocks geological area. The circa 1912 brick house was once home to several families over the last century. The state park opened in 2003, and the house was used as a visitor contact center and office. The house was completely remodeled in 2011 to bring back the history and charm of staying overnight in "the Castles." The lodge is fully furnished with linens, towels and toiletries. When renting the lodge, you have an option to add two full-service RV campsites, creating an expanded facility for your group.

### Helpful Hints During Your Stay

Park staff want to ensure that you have safe and memorable experience, so we suggest these helpful hints:

- Stop in at the visitor center in Almo for guidebooks, trail maps, and the latest opportunities and programs.
- For cooler ventilation in summer, turn on the ceiling fan, open the windows in the evening, and close the blinds during the day.
- For additional heating in winter, use the propane fireplace and extra blankets available for your use.
- Although your lodge can be locked when unoccupied, consider locking valuables in your vehicle.
- Refer to the lodge guest book for local information and nearby amenities.
- The deck and house are for lodge guests only, but other visitors may use the picnic area on the east side.

### Check-out Procedures

1. Check-out time for lodge guests is noon.
2. Wash and disinfect soiled dishes. Instructions are posted at the lodge.
3. Please ensure that you have retrieved all personal items.
4. Check the lights and small appliances, making sure they are turned off.
5. Lock all of the doors and windows.
6. Return the key to visitor center. If visitor center is closed on the day you check out, leave the key on dining table.
7. Don't forget to leave us a note in the Lodge Journal, telling us about your adventures and lodging experience!
8. If you encountered any problems or discomforts during your stay, please fill out a comment card to the park manager and leave it on the dining room table.

### RULES FOR LODGE GUESTS

- Pets are not allowed inside the lodge
- Smoking in the lodge is prohibited
- Guest may not pitch tents or park other camping units at the lodge site but may rent two RV campsites adjacent to the lodge for an additional fee.
- Confine outside campfires to the designated fire ring provided.
- Guests are responsible for damages in excess of normal wear and tear. At no time may more than 8 people occupy the lodge.
- Fee includes up to three vehicles in the designated parking area.
- Equestrian users please use the hitching post available at the lower parking lot.
