

Colorado National Monument is striving to make your visit as enjoyable as possible by making facilities as accessible as possible. If you have questions not answered by this guide, please call the visitor center at 970-858-3617 ext. 360, or visit www.nps.gov/colm/planyourvisit/accessibility.

Visitor Center	The visitor center, located 4 miles inside the park from the west entrance, offers accessible restrooms and picinic tables, information, open-captioned audiovisual programs (induction loop available for users of hearing aids), exhibits (an audio description tour using handheld device is available) and retail sales area.
Campground	Saddlehorn Campground has 80 sites in three loops. Wheelchair accessible sites are located in Loop A, #5 (open year-round) and in Loop C, #70 (open during summer only.) These sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Many other campsites are level and negotiable by wheelchair users. All campground restrooms are accessible.
Overlooks	From west to east along Rim Rock Drive, Independence Monument View, Coke Ovens Overlook and Cold Shivers Point are designated accessible overlooks. Book Cliffs View along the Saddlehorn Campground-Picnic Area loop road is also accessible.
Restrooms	Accessible restrooms area available at the visitor center, campground and Devils Kitchen Picnic Area.
Fees	The America the Beautiful-National Parks Federal Recreational Lands Access Pass is a lifetime pass available to U.S. citizens and permanent residents who have a permanent disability. It can be obtained free-of-charge at the entrance stations. Pass holders and those who accompany the pass holder in the same vehicle receive free entrance and 50% discount on camping fees.
Picnic Areas	Accessible picnic tables are located at the visitor center and Devils Kitchen Picnic Area.

Service Animals

Service animals (*leashed* and *identified as a service* animal) are allowed in all public facilities and on trails.

Trails

The Alcove Nature Trail, which starts at the SE end of the visitor center parking lot where designated accessible parking is available, has a 5-foot wide hard-packed trail surface and leads 1/4 mile to an overlook of upper Wedding Canyon. It is suitable for people who use wheeled assistance devices.
