## \*Spring Equinox Hike

**Tuesday, March 20 9am-2pm**

Celebrate the first day of spring by taking a hike! Explore the unmaintained route along the Bench with Park Ranger Briana. 4 miles, moderate terrain. Pre-registration required.



## It's Alive!

**Sunday, March 25 2-3pm at Saddlehorn Visitor Center**

Join Dr. Aparna Palmer from Colorado Mesa University for a short walk on the Alcove Nature Trail to learn about biological soil crust followed by an indoor presentation on the microscopic organisms that call the crust home. Microscopes will be available to get a close up view of these amazing critters!



## \*Red and Columbus Canyons Hike

**Wednesday, April 4 9am-2pm**

Take a hike off the beaten path with Park Ranger Annie to explore the geology, ecology, and human history of these two remote canyons. 5 miles, strenuous terrain. Pre-registration required.



## \*Upper Ute Canyon Hike

**Thursday, April 12 & Saturday, April 14 8:30am-2pm**

Visit a unique pocket of Ute Canyon with geologist Don Regan and biologist John Moore to explore its spring flora, fauna, and geology. This 3-4 mile strenuous hike includes an 800 ft. elevation gain along a primitive unmaintained trail. Hiking boots strongly recommended. Pre-registration required.
