Forest

Biological communities that are dominated by trees and other woody vegetation

- Boreal
- Temperate deciduous
- Tropical
- Broadleaf



Tundra

The tundra biome is the coldest of all terrestrial eco-systems

- Low biotic diversity
- Simple vegetation structure
- Short season of growth and reproduction



- Artic
- Alpine

Desert

Deserts occur where rainfall is < 50 cm/year. There are relatively few large mammals in deserts because most are not capable of storing sufficient water and withstanding the heat. Little shelter from the sun.

- Hot and dry
- Semiarid
- Coastal
- Cold

- Covers ¾ of Earth!




Grassland
