One character = one verbal sound. So, if there are 3 characters in the syllabary, there are 3 sounds in the verbal section.

 $V \otimes is 2$ characters. So, I need 2 verbal sounds = do ya. (English = bean) o is 1 character. So, I need 1 verbal sound = ka. (English = Attention!)
