Teacher's Guide Student Activity 1: Read about the Battle of Tupelo

Directions: Read the <u>Summary of the Battle of Tupelo (July14-15, 1864)</u> and answer the following questions.

- 1. How was General Sherman's overall strategy being affected by Confederate forces in Mississippi? *Answers should discuss the danger to the Union supply lines running from Tennessee to Georgia*
- 2. What did Sherman hope General Smith would accomplish when he marched into Mississippi? Sherman hoped Smith would preoccupy the Confederate army and prevent them from moving against his rear area and destroy the Confederate army
- 3. What are some of the advantages that the Union forces had over the Confederates at the battle? What kind of disadvantages did the Union forces have? Some advantages were: the Union had more men, they defended high ground and had constructed breastworks. Some disadvantages were they were far away from their home base and operating in enemy territory.
- 4. Why do you think the Confederates lost so many more men than the Union at the Battle of Tupelo? *Answers will vary but should include that they were outnumbered, forced to attack uphill, the Union had breastworks, etc.*
- 5. Do you agree that this battle was a Union victory? Why or why not? Answers will vary but should include information reflecting an understanding of the Union objectives as stated in the reading.
