

What do you notice in the webcam view of this habitat that would provide for bears needs of shelter, water, food, and space?

Go to the "Where Are the Bears?" link found on https://www.nps.gov/subjects/bears/index.htm

- Uncheck all the boxes on the left.
- Ask your students where they think Polar Bears live? (Click the Polar Bears Box to show then uncheck it).
- Ask your students where they think Brown/Grizzly Bears live? (Click the Brown/Grizzly Bear box then uncheck it).
- Then ask your students where they think Black Bears live? (Click the Black Bear box, then click all boxes).
- You are noticing areas on the map that don't have bears. Why
 might that be? (Habitat loss from city and town development).


