Introduction:

Instructions:

- 1. Students will use what they have learned about the water cycle and watersheds to write a persuasive letter to someone about the importance of water conservation and pollution prevention.
- 2. Review the elements of a persuasive letter with the students. The letter must clearly state a position and provide evidence in support of their position.
- 3. Students may choose to write to a character from the Enviroscape activity -the factory owners, the farmer, the homeowners, the commuters, etc. Students may also choose to write to a member of their family, a friend, or prominent community member or politician.
- 4. Students should incorporate the idea of a water cycle and how it affects Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Park. Students may wish to refer to the park map to familiarize themselves with the parks' resources. Where might the polluted water from the lake end up? How might it get back up to the mountains?
