DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

by Rev. Gordon Winston Former Name of Claimant here.

that she had never been previously married; that the soldier had never been previously married.
Or had Not. That both her former husband & the former wife of her late husband
If there was a prior marriage of either, the date and place of death or divorce of former consort or consorts should be stated.

That she has not remarried since the death of said soldier. That she is without other means of support
than her daily labor.

That the said soldier left no ~~the following named~~ children now under sixteen years of age to wit:

If the soldier left no children, the claimant should so state.

That she has not heretofore applied for pension. If prior application has been made, the number
