Water Pump

A hand-cranked pump raised water from a shallow well or cistern. This type of pump cycled small rubber buckets on a chain and dumped the water through the spigot.

Water Pitcher & Wash Basin

Water stored in the pitcher is poured into the basin for hand washing.

Cook Stove

A wood burning stove required constant attention when cooking. Without a thermostat the cook had to control the heat by hand, adjusting the various vents and doors.

A hand-butter churn was an improvement over the plunge-type churn, but still required physical effort to make butter.

Kerosene Lamp

Lamps burned kerosene to provide light at night. People had to light and extinguish the wicks, and refill the gas.

Streets were often muddy or dusty and filled with animal manure. To remove boots without using your hands, you could wedge the heel of the boot into the top of the jack and pull your foot out.

Flatirons weighed a few pounds and had to be heated atop the stove before using it to get the wrinkles out of clothes.

Chamber Pot

In wintry weather or the middle of the night, people could use a small pot as a toilet, to be emptied in the outdoor privy later.
