What Will You Take for That?

While the expedition was in settled territory, there was a need for money to make purchases. It was only after they went beyond the last settlement that trading and hunting became their only means of acquiring items they needed to survive.

Lewis spent more money on Indian presents or trade items than on anything else. Along with other supplies, these items were distributed among different bundles so each bale contained a variety of goods. In Philadelphia, almost \$700 was spent on Indian presents. The following list contains some of the more common items.
