Report to the King: Assessment

Missionaries like Padre Kino had to report back to their superiors about their progress, challenges, and requests. Padre Kino was known for his optimism and positive attitude. One critic in 1695 said of Kino,

"He saw a forest where there was only mesquite bush, and a lake where there was a puddle of water."

After having collected your badges, it's time to report back to the king about your journey. These letters are like writing your own report card, so you'll want to take a lesson from Padre Kino and make it:

PEPI

Positive Describe your successes and leave out the failures!

Enthusiastic Use large and glowing words like "magnificent" or "astounding."

(Adjectives like "cool" and "fun" don't work on kings.)

Persuasive Convince the king that you should be sent on additional quests!

Ingratiating Address the reader with respect.

Kino and other subjects of the king often signed their letters with

"your humble servant" or "in obedience and gratitude."

In order to properly convey your experience on the Quest, you may want to mention:

- the landscape and environment
- the people you met
- the buildings
- the obstacles you faced
- the discoveries you made
