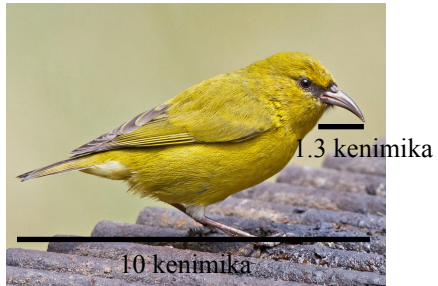
‘Apapane Kāne	16 kalani	0.56 ‘auneki

E. ‘Amakihi: He manu li‘ili‘i nō ka ‘amakihi. He 10 kenimika (3.9‘īniha) ko lākou nui. ‘O ka melemele ‘ōma‘oma‘o kona waiho‘olu‘u me ka nuku ‘ele‘ele li‘ili‘i he 1.3kenimika (0.51‘īniha) kona lō‘ihi a he mau maka māku‘e kona me nā ‘ōmaka ‘ele‘ele.
