Snow-mobiling

Snowmobile use is permitted at Crater Lake National Park only on the North Entrance Road from the park boundary to North Junction, where the entrance road meets Rim Drive. Snowmobile use is limited to that part of the North Entrance Road intended for wheeled vehicles.

To ensure protection of the park's natural resources and to provide safety for all winter users, please comply with these regulations:

- Off-road travel is prohibited. Snowmobiles must stay on the groomed trail.
- All operators must possess and carry a valid state drivers license or a state snowmobile permit.
- Operators under 16 years of age must be accompanied and supervised within line of sight by a responsible person age 21 or older.
- Operators under 12 years of age must be accompanied on the same machine by a responsible person age 21 or older.
- ATV's and all other wheeled vehicles are prohibited when the park is open to snowmobiles.
- Operators must carry and display a valid state registration for each snowmobile.
- Maximum speed is 45 mpg.
- Snowmobiles must be equipped with a muffler in good working order.
- All other federal and state laws regarding snowmobiles apply.
- No pets allowed more than 50 feet from a plowed road.

Snow-mobiling

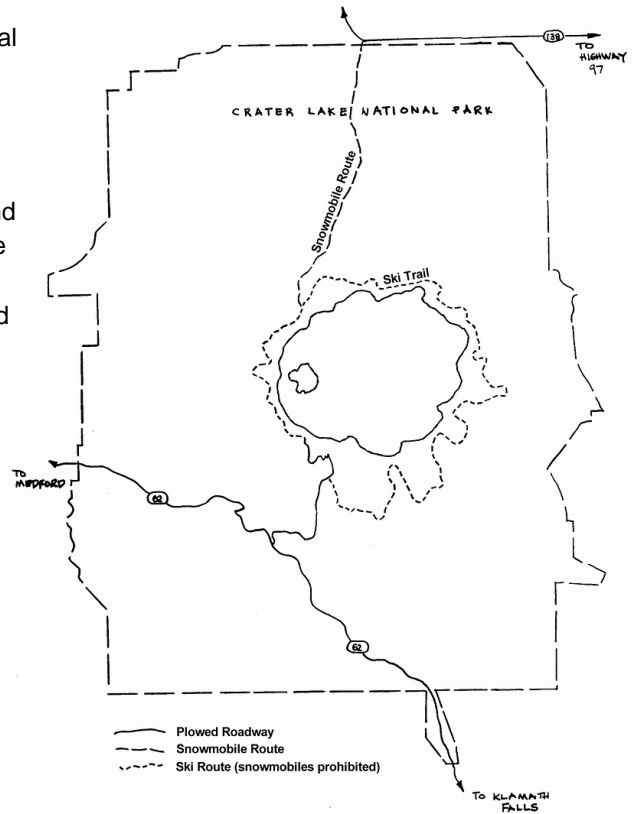

- Maximum speed is 45 mpg.
- Snowmobiles must be equipped with a muffler in good working order.
- All other federal and state laws regarding snowmobiles apply.
- No pets allowed more than 50 feet from a plowed road.

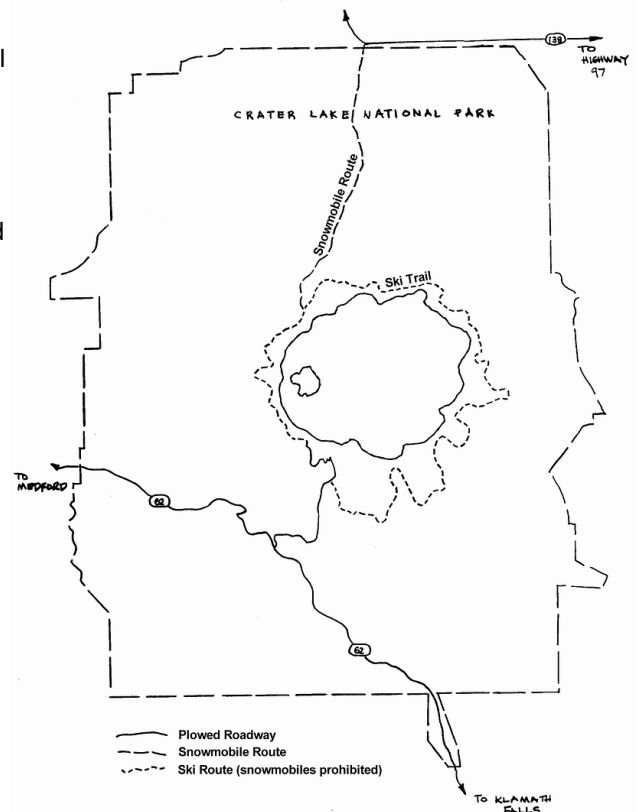
