Forecast

Today: Rain before 11am, then rain and snow. High near 36. Southwest wind 16 to 21 mph decreasing to 9 to 14 mph in the morning. Winds could gust as high as 31 mph. Chance of precipitation is 100%. Little or no snow accumulation expected.

Tonight: A chance of rain and snow before 11pm. Partly cloudy, with a low around 32. South southwest wind 11 to 17 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. Chance of precipitation is 40%. Little or no snow accumulation expected.

Friday: Mostly sunny, with a high near 39. South southeast wind 5 to 9 mph.

Friday Night: Rain after 11pm. Low around 31. Southeast wind 8 to 17 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. Chance of precipitation is 90%. New precipitation amounts between a tenth and quarter of an inch possible.

Saturday: Rain before 11am, then rain and snow. High near 34. South wind around 15 mph, with gusts as high as 23 mph. Chance of precipitation is 100%. Little or no snow accumulation expected.

Saturday Night: Rain and snow. Low around 29. Chance of precipitation is 80%. New snow accumulation of 1 to 2 inches possible.

Sunday: Rain and snow likely. Cloudy, with a high near 32. Chance of precipitation is 60%. New snow accumulation of 2 to 4 inches possible.
