3.3 miles of Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail Reopens

Towpath Trail is now open from Lock 29 in Peninsula to Hunt House in Cuyahoga Falls

Brecksville, Ohio – The National Park Service (NPS) has completed trail work and has reopened 3.3 miles of the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail in Cuyahoga Valley National Park from Lock 29 Trailhead in Peninsula to Hunt House Trailhead in Cuyahoga Falls. NPS staff will continue to make repairs on the remaining closed 3.4 miles of the Towpath Trail from Hunt House Trailhead in Cuyahoga Falls to Botzum Trailhead in Akron.

Trail assessments throughout the park continue and additional closures are also in effect. These closures include:

- Wetmore Trail
- Perkins Run Trail
- Lake Trail, including the Kendall Lake Parking Lot on Truxell Road
- Valley Trail, south of SR 303
- Langes Run Trail, south of Wetmore Road
- Hunt House and associated events

Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad will operate a modified schedule between Rockside Station in Independence and Peninsula Depot. Visit www.cvsr.com for details.

Please check www.nps.gov/cuva in advance of traveling to the park for updates.

If visiting the park, expect downed trees, mud, and standing water. Please respect all park closures for the safety of visitors, resource, and park staff. Please do not drive or walk through moving water or designated closed areas.
