### **Celebrate St. Patrick's Day with Local Celtic Band, Pitch the Peat**

**Brecksville, Ohio** – On Sunday, March 16, 2014, Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP) and the Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park will host their monthly house concert featuring Ed Caner who serves as both musician and host. The series, which occurs on the third Sunday of every month through May, highlights local guest performers and different styles of music in the intimate setting of a restored bank barn, on the Hines Hill Campus.

During the past 15 years, Ed Caner has performed as a sideman for over 50 major acts. Joining Ed this month is Pitch the Peat, a dynamic four-piece Celtic ensemble with roots in County Clare, Ireland. Their musical talents span many genres and they delight in exploring the common threads in their vast repertoire from traditional Irish to contemporary for an entertaining evening of music.

The concert begins at 7 p.m. and doors open at 6:30 p.m. Admission: \$8 adults, \$6 Conservancy members. Seating is limited.
