### Hey Mavis to Play Two House Concerts in Cuyahoga Valley

*Second show added due to performer popularity and series success*

**Brecksville, Ohio** – On Sunday, November 16, 2014, Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP) and the Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park will host their monthly house concert featuring former CVNP Artist-in-Residence Ed Caner who serves as both musician and host. The series, which occurs on the third Sunday of every month through May, highlights local guest performers and different styles of music in the intimate setting of a restored bank barn, on the Hines Hill Campus.

This month will feature two shows. Concerts start at 4:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. Doors open at 4 p.m. and 6:30 p.m., respectively. Admission: \$8 adults, \$6 Conservancy members. Seating is limited. Violinist/Fiddler Ed Caner has been labeled by the Cleveland *Plain Dealer* as, "One of the most versatile musicians on the planet." During the past 15 years, he has performed as a sideman for over 50 major acts, interim Concertmaster of the Wheeling Symphony Orchestra, and performed as section violinist with The Cleveland Chamber Symphony, Cleveland Ballet, and Cleveland Opera Orchestra. Ed has also performed over 750 shows as soloist with Michael Stanley, Wayne Newton, The New Barleycorn, and the Broadway musical, *I Love You, You're Perfect, Now Change*.

Joining Ed this month are members of his band Hey Mavis. With songs that effortlessly float from softly orchestrated lullabies to raw and raucous love songs, the music of Hey Mavis is best described as "Appalachian Americana". Their lyrics focus heavily on the beautiful imagery of life, the joy and labor of raising children, and the timeless themes of love and heartbreak. Joining Ed are wife and Hey Mavis co-founder Laurie Michelle Caner on banjo, Bryan Thomas on bass, and Kevin Johnson on guitar.
