### Peninsula Depot Changes Function

*Facility moves from a visitor center to a ticket sales operation*

**Brecksville, Ohio** – The National Park Service announces a change in the services provided at the Peninsula Depot Visitor Center. The National Park Service will discontinue offering visitor services at this facility after Sunday, February 23, 2014. Park rangers and volunteers will be in the area for questions and directions during peak visitation times when the train is in Peninsula. The facility, which is owned by the Peninsula Foundation and leased by CVSR, will now provide train ticket sales and railroad information. The hours of operations are to be determined. The facility name will change from Peninsula Depot Visitor Center to Peninsula Depot. Park information will be available at Trail Mix Peninsula, a retail store adjacent to Peninsula Depot.

Other name changes occurring in the national park include the following.

- Hunt Farm Visitor Information Center to **Hunt House**. A self-serve facility, Hunt House is staffed by volunteers on the weekends. It offers many activities for children inside the building. The grassy lawn offers opportunities for ranger-led or facilitated events at Hanging Out @ Hunt. The new name prevents confusion with Hale Farm and Village and the Countryside Initiative Farms.
- Everett Road Covered Bridge to **Everett Covered Bridge** to match current signage.

The park will update signs, park maps, and information throughout the year.

CVNP encompasses 33,000 acres along the Cuyahoga River between Cleveland and Akron, Ohio. Managed by the National Park Service, CVNP combines cultural, historical, recreational, and natural activities in one setting.
