Cuyahoga Valley House Concert Series Continues

Brecksville, Ohio – On Friday, February 12, Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP) is hosting another inviting evening of music for its Cuyahoga Valley House Concert Series. This series features current Artist-in-Residence Ed Caner who serves as both musician and host. The series, which occurs once a month through May, will highlight different styles of music in the intimate setting of a restored bank barn, on the Hines Hill Campus. Joining Ed Caner for tonight's concert is the local trio, *The Crooked River Stompers*, who will play a variety of traditional music on stringed instruments, including violin, mandolin, guitar, tenor, and five-string banjo. Drawing from the members' vast experience in many musical genres, highlights will include classic ragtime, ragtime blues, American and Celtic fiddle tunes, hot jump tunes, and old swing numbers.
