Tonight's Music in the Meadow Concert Canceled at National Park

Brecksville, Ohio – Due to weather conditions this evening, the Music in the Meadow concert at Howe Meadow in Cuyahoga Valley National Park is canceled. The concert, featuring *Hey Mavis!*, will be rescheduled for a later date this summer.

The next FREE concert is on Wednesday, June 17, when *Mo' Mojo* will present Zydeco music with energy and heat! The band's music adds Cajun melodies to blues sounds from throughout the south, combining French-style accordion, danceable drumbeats, rock-solid bass guitar, blazing electric guitar, and the ever-popular rub board.

The celebration begins with lawn games and activities for families and friends. Bring a Frisbee® or a kite! The concert series is presented by Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP) and the Cuyahoga Valley National Park Association (CVNPA) with promotional support by AudioTechnica. Alcohol prohibited. Howe Meadow. Activities begin at 5:30 p.m. Concerts begin at 6:30. In the event of severe weather, the concert will be canceled.
