Cuyahoga Valley House Concert Series Continues

Special Guest Pianist/Arranger Marge Adler Joins Artist-in-Residence Ed Caner

Brecksville, Ohio – On Friday, March 12, 2010, Artist-in-Residence Ed Caner and pianist/arranger Marge Adler will perform in the Cuyahoga Valley House Concert Series at Hines Hill Conference Center. The series, which occurs once a month through May, features Caner who serves as both musician and host, highlights different styles of music in the intimate setting of a restored bank barn. The series is presented by the National Park Service and Cuyahoga Valley National Park Association.

Joining Ed Caner for tonight's concert is critically acclaimed pianist and arranger Marge Adler. Together they will present a combination of standards, lighter classical pieces, and solo pieces. The Cleveland *Plain Dealer* called Marge "a treasure with at least three hands" and "worth the price of admission all by her lonesome."

Concerts start at 8 p.m. Doors open at 7:30. Admission: \$6 adults, \$5 CVNPA members. Advance sales are available by calling (330) 657-2909. Seating is limited. The facility is not wheelchair accessible. Complimentary refreshments will be served.

Hines Hill Conference Center is located at 1403 W. Hines Hill Road in Peninsula, approximately one mile east of Riverview Road.
