



Camping Regulations

Welcome to the Stanford backcountry camping area. We hope that you enjoy your stay! These camp sites along the Stanford Trail are for Towpath Trail and backcountry trail users only. Drive-up use is not permitted. The following information is provided to enhance your enjoyment and to assist with preservation and protection of your national park, for present and future generations to enjoy.

Tent Camping Is By Reservation Only

Contact the Cuyahoga Valley National Park Association (CVNPA), Reservation Coordinator's Office, at (330) 657-2909, ext. 119, Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

On Saturday and Sunday, walk-up campers can reserve available sites by visiting Trail Mix store from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Trail Mix is located at 1565 Boston Mills Road in Peninsula, across from the Boston Store Visitor Center.

Fee: \$18 per night/ \$15 CVNPA members, per campsite, 6-person limit. No more than 10 nights per season.

Check-in after 1 p.m. and check-out by 10 a.m. Juveniles must be accompanied by an adult at least 18 years of age. For more details visit www.cvnpa.org.

Camp In Designated Areas Only

Campsites are numbered and delineated by mowed areas. There are five tent sites. There is a limitation of six people and two tents per site. There is a picnic table at each site. A water tank and a portable toilet are located in the developed area by the Stanford Barn. Camping is not permitted at the group fire ring.

Keep Wildlife Wild! Feeding, Disturbing Or Molesting Animals Is Prohibited

Hang your food on the provided food storage posts. This prevents habituating animals to human food sources.

Pets Must Remain Under Physical Control At All Times

Pets must be kept in a tent or on a leash no greater than six-feet long. Pets must not be left unattended. Please clean up after them.

Alcoholic Beverages Are Prohibited

Campfires Are Only Allowed in the Group Fire Ring

Use firewood that is provided. Wood gathering is prohibited within the park. Due to the danger of blowing sparks, all fires must be extinguished prior to retiring at night or vacating the site. **Fires must not be left unattended at any time.**

Pack It In, Pack It Out

To be good stewards, pack out what you pack in. Please keep your site clean, the way you would like to find it.

Quiet Hours Are 10:00 P.M. TO 6:00 A.M.

Please be considerate of your fellow campers.

Leave What You Find

Allow others a sense of discovery by leaving wildlife, plants, etc. undisturbed. All plants, animals, artifacts, and other natural resources are protected by law in national parks.
