REGULATIONS

1. **NPS ENTRANCE FEE:** Each client (guides are exempt) is required to pay a \$15.00 per person NPS Park Entrance fee. Interagency and park specific passes are accepted in lieu of the entrance fee. This fee is payable at the time of check in or in person at your air taxi.

1. **REMOVAL OF HUMAN WASTE:** Removal of solid human waste is required when base camping and when camping within ½ mile of a glacier airstrip. CMCs are available from the Walter Harper Talkeetna Ranger Station. If you plan to use your own waste removal system, please ensure you have air taxi approval. Waste management regulations are strictly enforced and failure to comply for any reason will result in citations.

3. **LEAVE NO TRACE:** Everything brought into the Park must be brought out. Abandoning surplus gear, food, fuel or any other item is not allowed. Inspect campsites for spilled food and pack out all food waste. Violators will be issued citations.

3. **CLEARLY IDENTIFY AND BURY EACH CACHE:** Each cache must be marked with your group's information, marked with 5 to 6 foot (1.5 – 2 m) wands, and buried at least 1 meter deep to prevent raiding by ravens. Permanent caches are not allowed. Below 6,000 feet (2000 m) food caches must be stored in 3 layers of plastic bags or bear-proof containers to prevent attracting wildlife. All caches belonging to other parties should be left intact. Please report abandoned or unmarked caches to NPS rangers.

3. **LEAVE ONLY FOOTPRINTS:** It is illegal to remove natural objects from the park.

Denali National Park and Preserve recognizes that a certain number of park visitors each year will become ill, injured, or incapacitated in some way. It is the policy of Denali National Park and Preserve to assist those in need, when, in the opinion of the park personnel apprised of the situation, it is necessary, appropriate, within the reasonable skill and technical capability of park personnel, and provides searchers and rescuers with a reasonable margin of safety.

Search and Rescue operations are conducted on a discretionary basis. The level and exigency of the response is determined by field personnel based on their evaluation of the situation. Rescue is not automatic. Denali National Park and Preserve expects park users to exhibit a degree of self-reliance and responsibility for their own safety commensurate with the degree of difficulty of the activities they undertake.

In the event you or any of your clients are rescued (aerial evacuation or ground rescue) while climbing in Denali National Park and Preserve, you may be obligated to pay for air or ground ambulance costs. If you are rescued your permit will be voided.
