Driving Directions: We are located at 8300 De Soto Memorial Hwy, Bradenton, FL 34209.

From I-75, take exit 220 west SR 64/ Manatee Ave. Travel 12 miles to 75th Street West. Turn right and travel to its terminus to the park's entrance.

From I-275 exit 5 follow US-19 into Bradenton. Turn West onto SR-64/ Manatee Ave 5 miles to 75th Street West. Turn right onto 75th Street West, and proceed 2.5 miles to its terminus at the park's entrance.
