



Devils Tower National Monument 2016 WRITERS IN RESIDENCY

Submission Guidelines

Two one-week residencies one for prose and one for poetry will be available at the Monument. Selected individuals will be offered housing at the monument. A \$400 travel stipend is provided by the Devils Tower Natural History Association. The goal of this residency is to provide an inspiring, secluded working environment for promising writers. - Please follow these guidelines. Failure to follow stated rules and submission guidelines will result in disqualification.
- **Your name must not appear anywhere on the manuscript.** Include a cover sheet, listing genre, title of work, your name, address, phone number, and a one-paragraph bio. Manuscripts will not be returned.
- Entries must be postmarked by August 1, 2016. Winners may not reapply for a 1 year period.
- Writing may have been previously published but must be retyped to conform to manuscript guidelines.
- Submit one copy of work, typed, double-spaced (not 1 ½ spaced) and printed on 16 or 20-pound 8 ½ x 11" white paper. Use 12 pt. Times New Roman font with 1 inch margins. Clean photocopies are acceptable; no carbon copies please.
- Paper clip pages together, do not staple or use any cover or binder;.
- Prose manuscripts should be no more than 2,500 words, or 10 pages (excess pages will be discarded.) Poetry manuscripts maybe single spaced with one poem per page, up to five poems, total submission not to exceed five pages.
- Manuscript pages must be consecutively numbered, starting with page 1. Each page should list title of work and genre, choosing from one of these six: fiction, non-fiction, fiction for children, non-fiction for children, and poetry, poetry for children.
- Do not send supplementary materials, such as photos or illustrations.
- Notification to winners will be sent by October 15, 2016.
- Winners must contribute to the Tower Story Box, answering the question "What does the Tower mean to you?" Writings must be received by February 28, 2017.

Please make sure that you follow all of the above guidelines-several several of last year's submissions were disqualified for not following these guidelines.

Each entry goes through three stages of judging, using the following criteria: clarity of message or theme; technical merit/grammar, composition, etc.: style/language skills/grace of language; creativity/originality; overall like/dislike/gut reaction.
