



Exploring the Reserve For FilmSlam

Welcome to Ebey's Landing National Historical Reserve!

What You Need To Know:

ROADS:

- Cars, bicycles, horses and pedestrians share the Reserve's narrow country roads with working farm vehicles. Please obey signs and speed limits, and be prepared to yield to farm vehicles.
- You cannot stop traffic, block public access to roads or trails, or park on private property.

TRAILS:

- Please stay on trails. This protects adjacent private property, including farm fields.

FARMS:

- Please do not enter farm fields. They are private property and this can damage crops. Please do not pick produce. Some crops may not be intended for food.
- You cannot enter historic buildings or trespass on private property.

PARKING:

- State Park areas require a Discover Pass. Passes are available at Fort Casey, Fort Ebey, or online at the Washington State Parks website.

DOGS:

- To protect wildlife and keep dogs from entering private property, dogs must be on leash when on

trails. Island County provides an off-leash area on Patmore Road.

- Please pick up after your dog. Not all beach and trail areas have trash pickup and plastic bags are a litter problem

RESTROOMS:

- There is a public Port-a-Potty on the trail to the Ebey House (down the farm lane, just beyond the gate).
- There is a public restroom at Ebey's Landing State Park.

TRASH:

- To keep this place beautiful, please pack out what you pack in. Not all beach and trail areas have garbage pick-up service.

CAMPING:

- Camping is not allowed at the Prairie Overlook, Cottage or Prairie Wayside, or on private property without owner permission.
- Camping is available at Island County's Rhododendron Park, just south of Coupeville on Hwy. 20 and at Fort Ebey State Park and Fort Casey State Park. Contact Washington State Parks for reservations and information.
