

## The Royal Road

El Camino Real de los Tejas connected Mexico City to western Louisiana. Think of traveling 400 years ago through swollen rivers, vast forests, wet swamps, and hot deserts. Missionaries and soldiers used the route to increase and protect Spain's claim on the land across the breadth of today's Texas –1,000 miles! The American Indians living there experienced great change. Texas is a big state with a long history!




