





**Pinelands Route:** Ride thru a pineland forest, home of the Florida panther, and discover the most diverse habitat in the Everglades.

**Hole In The Donut Route:** Ride along the Old Ingraham Highway to the exciting Hole in the Donut restoration project. Be one of the last to enjoy the fabulous views and birding from “Mt. Schinus” while it’s still standing.

### Anhinga Amble – 10:30 a.m. Daily. 50 minutes

Interested in seeing wildlife? Join a Ranger in exploring the Anhinga trail where Alligators, wading birds and other wildlife can be easily and frequently spotted. ♿

### Glades Glimpse – 1:30 p.m. Daily. 20 minutes


Learn about fascinating Everglades’ tidbits at this short talk. Topics vary daily. Meet at the Royal Palm benches. ♿

### Slough Slog – 2:00 p.m. Sun, Mon, Tue, Wed & Fri. 2 hours.

Wade through the river of grass into the shadows of a ‘gator hole’ or cypress dome. Wear lace-up shoes, socks, and long pants that can get wet or muddy. Stop by the Ernest Coe Visitor Center or call 305-242-7700 for reservations and information.

### Mahogany Hammock Walk – 3 pm. Mon, Tue, Wed & Sat 1 hour

Experience one of the most beautiful tree islands in the Everglades! Meet in the Mahogany Hammock parking lot, halfway between Royal Palm and Flamingo. ♿

bancos del centro de interpretación Royal Palm. Programa Gratis. ♿


**Pa-Hay-Okee** – 3 p.m. Sun, Thu & Fri 30 minutes

**Evening Program** – 7:30 p.m. Mon, Wed, Thu & Sat 50 minutes Meet under the stars at the amphitheater located at the south end of Long Pine Key Campground. Check bulletin boards and visitor centers for the night's topic. Flashlights recommended. ♿

**Starlight Walk** – 7:30 p.m. Sun, Tue & Fri 50 minutes

Experience the Anhinga Trail by starlight! Night herons, pig frogs, fireflies and gator eyes create a completely different atmosphere on the trail at night. Meet at the Royal Palm benches. Flashlights recommended. ♿



**Car Caravan** – 10 a.m. Tue 5 hours.

Make the dramatic descent from the pine rocklands to Florida Bay. Although you won't notice the elevation change, you will experience every habitat type in the Everglades on this 40 mile trip from the Coe Visitor Center to Flamingo. **Nike Missile Site Tour** – 2 p.m. Sat & Sun 1 ½ hour.

Did you know that there is an historic Nike Missile Base within Everglades National Park?!
