## **Yosemite Announces Fire Season**

Yosemite fire managers have announced that the 2014 Fire Season will begin on Monday, May 19, 2014. Fire season officially begins when seasonal firefighting equipment and personnel are in place, prepared and ready to respond. Additionally, grasses and other vegetation at the lower elevations have begun to dry out. This year, vegetation is drying out faster than average due to the low snowpack the park received over the last three winter seasons, making for fire danger above average for this time of year.

The park is currently transitioning to fire season preparedness and fire resources will be available seven days per week for suppression efforts within the park. In park fire resources for the season include: fire management officials, four Type 3 wildland engines, one helicopter, and one hand crew.

In preparation for the fire season, the park will begin defensible space inspections throughout Yosemite's communities, including Aspen Valley, Hodgdon Meadows, Foresta, El Portal, Yosemite Valley, and Wawona starting on Monday, June 9. Residents and homeowners are urged to clear a defensible space of 100 feet or to property lines around homes and other structures in an effort

to reduce the risk of fire hazards.

With the official declaration of fire season, pile burning will be discontinued throughout the park until the fire potential is elevated statewide and has moved peak fire season conditions earlier than predicted.

Yosemite National Park urges local residents and visitors to "Please be Fire Safe," when residing and visiting the park and other public lands. Special attention should be given when departing campgrounds, backcountry camping sites, and picnic areas to make sure all campfires have been appropriately doused with water.

## **CONSTRUCTION UPDATES**

## El Portal Road Closure in Old El Portal (Night Work---May 19th thru May 22nd-----8PM to 8AM--Road To Be Closed After Last Shuttle Bus Run)

Starting next Monday night, May 19th crews will repair the short segment of the EI Portal Road located just west of the EI Portal post office, between Foresta Road and CA St. Rte. 140. This is the roughly 500-ft. of connector road in Old EI Portal between Odgers Entrance Road and the Post Office. The Crews will be working from 8PM to 8AM and the road will be closed after the last Shuttle Bus run at night, so please use alternate roads for entering and exiting Old EI Portal. This short section of road will be closed to all traffic between 8 pm and 8 am, except for Emergency Vehicles, Shuttle Bus and the School bus. Please use Foresta Road or Crane Creek Road as a detour to enter and exit Old EI Portal during these 4-nights of road work. There will also be up to 15 minute delays with flaggers on the Foresta Road at this intersection. Also, there will be some noise associated with the construction equipment, during these 4-nights of work, so please be patient while we complete these repairs.
